From the Divine Right of Kings to the awkward banter of young love, TAM's 54th season explores Shakespeare's flawed rulers in *Richard II* and forest-dwelling lovers in *As You Like It*; Peterson and O'Hare's modern take on the repercussions of war in *An Iliad*, Wilde's effervescent wit & wisdom in *The Importance of Being Earnest*, and Bartram & Hill's exploration on the reach of the bonds of friendship in *The Story of My Life*. TAM's *Brave New Worlds* Season is a lesson in humanity that will tickle your funny bone with one hand and pluck your heartstrings with the other.

The 2023 Summer Repertory Season includes Shakespeare's *Richard II* directed by Kathryn Walsh and *As You Like It* directed by Dawn McAndrews; Neil Bartram and Brian Hill's touching musical about friendship in *The Story of My Life* directed by Adam P. Blais with music direction by Courtney Babbidge; Lisa Peterson and Denis O'Hare's take on Homer's epic in *An Iliad* dramatizing the impact of war throughout the ages; originally directed by Bill van Horn; directed for 2023 by Dawn McAndrews; Oscar Wilde's *The Importance of Being Earnest* directed by Nathan Winkelstein; and for our Family Show, *Tall Tales Twice Told* by Dawn McAndrews directed by AJ Baldwin. For the Fall Show, TAM presents Gilbert & Sullivan's *HMS Pinafore* directed by Adam P. Blais with music direction by John Neal.

We are hopeful that you'll be chomping at the bit to join us for every exciting minute of our 2023 *Brave New Worlds* Season. Performances will take place mostly in Cumston Hall, the 250-seat Victorian opera house designed by Harry Cochrane. Great dramatic literature invites you to take a leap of faith into other worlds, other times, and other realities and find a bit of yourself, your fears, your joys, and your humanity. This year I, too, invite you to take that leap with TAM for this adventurous season!



The Story of My Life July 1 - August 17 Music & Lyrics by Neil Bartram Book by Brian Hill




An Iliad is a modern-day retelling of Homer's classic. Through poetry and humor, the ancient tale of the Trojan War, and the modern world collide in this captivating theatrical experience. The setting is simple: the empty theater. The time is now: the present moment. The lone figure onstage is a storyteller—possibly Homer, possibly one of the many bards who followed in his footsteps. He is fated to tell this story throughout history.

Richard II is dangerously out of touch with his kingdom. He wastes money, raises taxes to support his lavish lifestyle, plays favorites and cares more about his vanity than the common good. When Henry Bolingbroke—
father of the future Henry V—
challenges Richard for the throne, it's a
fight the king can't win. But in losing his crown he gains far greater things: his humanity and his soul. Shakespeare's luminous, poetic masterpiece is the first of four plays that chronicle the House of Lancaster's rise and the beginning of the Wars of the Roses.


The Importance of Being Earnest July 20 - August 19




Tall Tales Twice Told July 8 - August 17
